

In 2013, a volunteer Care Worker from the Dorcus CBO observed 12-year-old Elijah and his family's vulnerable situation from a distance and visited their home to learn more of their story.

Elijah's father had passed away many years earlier, and his mother struggled with a mental disability, which meant providing for her son's most basic needs was a challenge. The family often went hungry and, as a result, Elijah's health started to decline. Recognising the urgent need to be there for Elijah and his mother and to support them in their challenges, the Care Workers invited Elijah to the Care Point. Now he receives a hot and nutritious meal daily, his health has improved, and he is no longer malnourished.

In 2019, trauma and grief once again filled Elijah's heart when his mother passed away. With no one else to care for him, Elijah began living with his elderly grandmother, Justina*, who doesn't work outside of the home because of her age and limited mobility. In 2020, she started selling homemade alcohol but had to stop because of the COVID-19 pandemic. With little means of providing for her grandson, Justina is grateful for the support Elijah receives at the Care Point, as it relieves some of the burden she carries.
